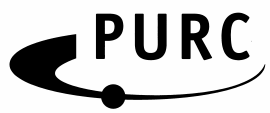

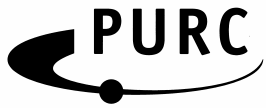
## *What we are doing*

# PURC *Steps*

- Choose your top three objectives and rank them from 1 to 3 (1 is highest) in the column "Personal Priorities"
